From the Acting Principal.....

Dear Parents / Caregivers,

What is STEM? Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths. Four faculties important to our learning and future employment. Did you know that research tells us that jobs for the future will require high relational support; hence 21st Century learning focuses on application to change, collaboration and creativity, increasing engagement and intellectual stretch. The strategies with the highest impact of self-efficacy are:- willingness to have a go, accepting that there is no right or wrong answer, providing opportunities to learn, growth mindset, positive belief that you can do it, a Can do attitude, confidence, involvement in achievable challenges and

intentional learning that are problem based. It is important to identify what students know and what they don't know to enable 21st century learners to work collaboratively using the disciplines of thinking: - mathematically, scientifically, emotionally, technically, creatively and artistically to solve problems and provide solutions. To enable students to work successfully in their future world they will require deep knowledge and an understanding of each of these disciplines. Once you have deep knowledge you can then see what you don't know or understand which leads to deeper learning. STEM is complex thinking with an interdisciplinary approach to problem solving using knowledge and collaboration to gain a deeper understanding. Help your children with this process by supporting and encouraging them to solve problems, experiment, ask questions and ponder rather than rescuing them and provide them with the answer.

Professional Development

- **AEDC**: - Early Years teachers will be released to complete the Australian Early Years Data Collection this term. This data provides us with important information about the wellbeing and needs of the children and families in our school and community.
- **National Consistent Collection Data**:- The National Consistent Collection data will occur again this term. This collection of data provides information to track the support required for students within our school.
- **Deb Lasscock – Maths** - This term all staff will continue learning about Executive Functions with Deb Lasscock. Deb is working with all staff in the area of maths.

Review Cycle

- As part of improvement and accountability we regularly engage in a review cycle where students, staff, parents and the wider community are asked to provide feedback to us. Throughout this semester Gem Kasse, Carly Nash and I have been visiting classes observing classroom practice, student engagement and have been meeting with groups of students to allow them voice in expressing information about their learning and engagement. Carly Nash has also been conducting the Bully Survey to monitor and gather additional information from Reception to Year 7 students within our school. In addition to this we will be issuing some questionnaires and surveys to gather feedback on the important work in our school by Bree our Pastoral Support Worker.
