From the Principal

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back, I hope you enjoyed the April holiday break with your children and took the opportunity to spend some valuable family time together making treasurable family memories. Students have returned to school looking fresh and ready to start another busy term.

Jo Chesson has announced her retirement, Caitlin Slevec is continuing to teach the students in T2, and we welcome Chris Gent back in T13 from her long service leave last term.

The new Spelling Mastery groups began on Wednesday and students have met their Spelling Mastery teacher and have settled into their new groups. Spelling Mastery starts at 8:55am which means students have 10 minutes to organise themselves, have their attendance recorded and complete any jobs they may be responsible for. We look forward to you supporting us by ensuring your child arrives at school on time every day. Students can enter the school grounds at 8:30am, during this time they can wait near their classrooms ready to enter between 8:40am and 8:45am. Your assistance and support with this will be greatly appreciated.

Staff spent the Pupil Free day on the first day of the school term looking deeper into the DIBELS reading data where they were able to analyse individual results of the students within their class and are equipped to focus on developing every student's fluency in reading which will improve their reading comprehension. You can support your child in this process as well by ensuring that you listen to them read every day. If your child is a reluctant reader or lacks confidence in their reading ability read to them, read with them, read the same book several times or ask them to read after you. These activities are important to develop reading. We look forward to measuring growth in reading fluency and comprehension when we review our DIBELS assessments again at the end of this term.

In 2024 students starting school will be able to start at the beginning of the year or mid-year, start of term 3 depending on their date of birth. If you have or know of families who have a child starting school in 2024 please encourage them to complete an enrolment form and make an appointment with me for a tour of the school as soon as they can.

Play Café is on Friday mornings and available to any preschool aged child within our community. This is a lovely space to meet others, enjoy a cappuccino or cup of tea with a scone and enable preschool age children play with others and explore the toys and activities in the Geoff Simpson Hall (OSHC building near the Campus Office).

The roof on Pilgrim School is being replaced which means there are some areas that have been fenced off and Pilgrim Front Office staff have relocated to the Campus Office. Campus Office will continue to operate on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings.






