

## From the Principal

Dear Parents/Carers,

As we continue our journey on improving reading outcomes for all students our staff continued to learn about analysing the DIBELS data for their students and interpreting the needs for individual students. Our focus over the next six weeks is on fluency. Students will be reassessed at the end of the term so that their teachers can analyse the data to measure growth and improvement for the students within their class. You can support your child at home by: - listening to them read, reading with them, or asking them to read the same text after you. Reading is the best way to improve reading. Regular practice is required to improve fluency which in turn improves reading comprehension. It doesn't really matter what your child is reading. If it is a little difficult for them, we suggest you read with them or ask them to read after you. If they are proficient readers, listen to them read and focus on them improving their expression. By working together, we look forward to celebrating the success of all students within our school.

Campus sport is underway; netball games started last week, and the ovals have now been lined and prepared for soccer games to commence in the next few weeks once the schedule is finalised.

Simon Wilson our Aboriginal Community Education Officer, ACEO, is coaching a group of interested Year 5 and Year 6 boys and girls to compete in the Sapsasa knockout soccer competition soon. These students will be coached by Simon on Fridays at lunch time. If your child is involved, please ensure they bring their soccer boots, or suitable shoes and shin guards for practice. Students involved in Pedal Prix will compete at the Bend on Saturday and our Youth Environment Leaders will attend their first Forum at Belair National Park on Tuesday.

Reconciliation Week is fast approaching, and Simon Wilson will be working with our First Nation students to host this assembly and help us learn more about Reconciliation and showcase the learning students have been involved in with their classmates and teachers in class. This assembly will be at 2:20pm on Friday in the PAC. Parents/Carers are welcome to attend this assembly. Last week there were capsicums available for sale from our school community garden, we are looking forward to seeing if there is more produce available again this assembly.

## STUDENT SAFETY

When playing on the oval students have been reminded to stay within the school grounds and play in areas where staff can see them. A line has been marked on the grass on the western end of the oval near the Fair Shed to identify the boundary to visually show students that they need to remain inside. The Sheoak trees have been trimmed to increase visibility on the edges of our oval and the opening on the north-western boundary fence has been closed to increase student safety. The rock walls around Campus are to retain the soil, and are homes to a variety of animals, students are reminded to stay off these walls and the garden areas and to remain inside the railings. ## TRANSITION TO HIGH SCHOOL

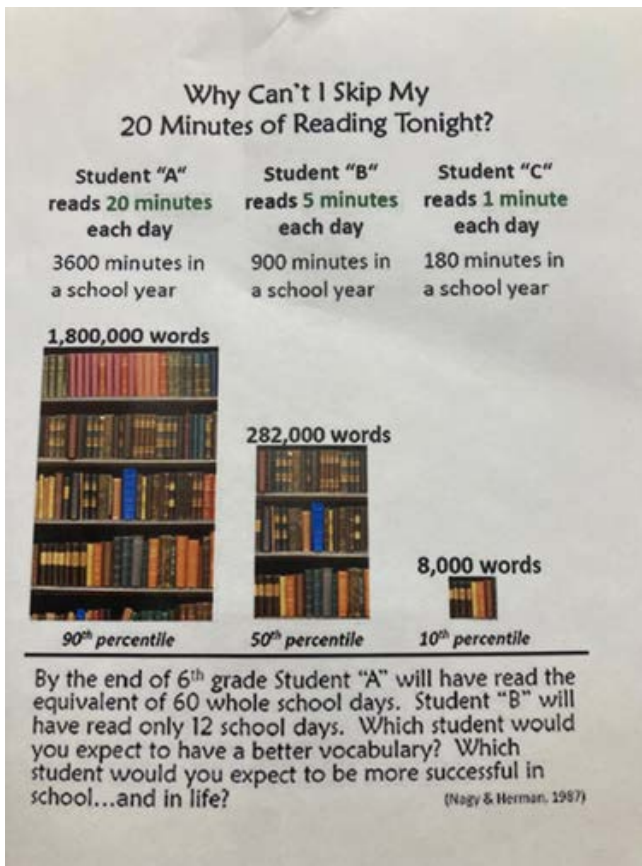

## MOTHER'S DAY

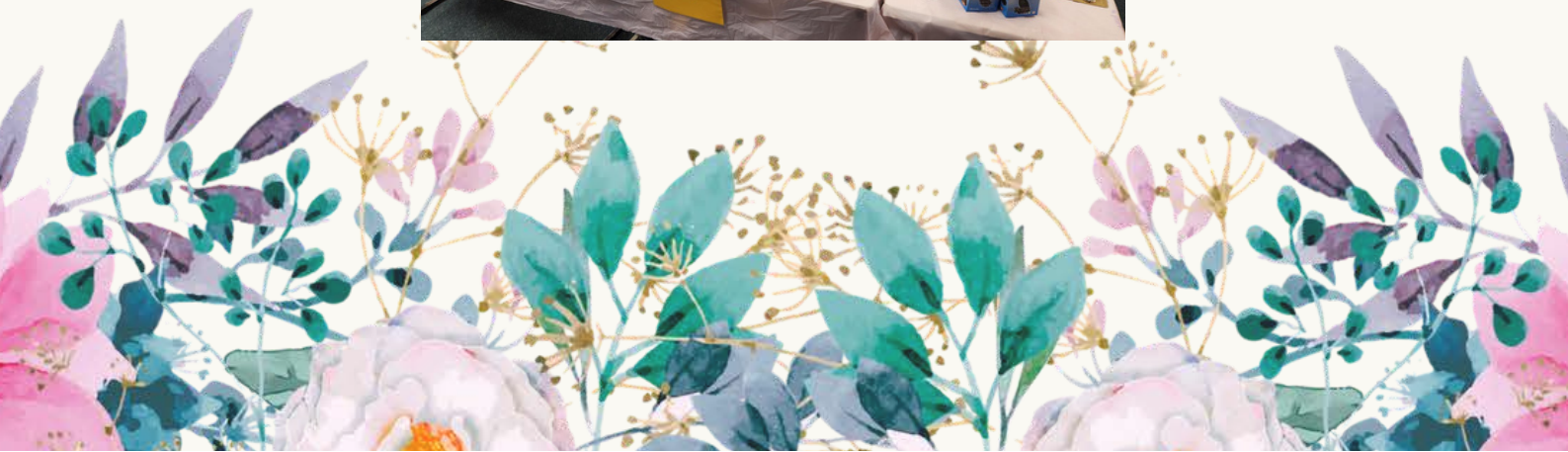

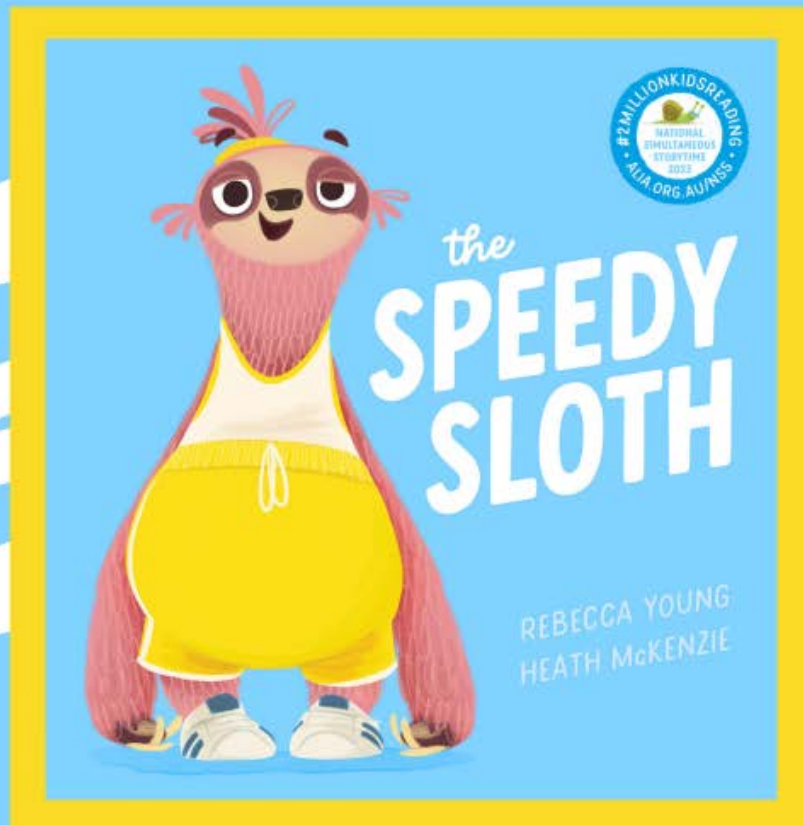
