Dear Parents/Carers,

Next week students in Reception to Year 4 will be participating in swimming lessons at Noarlunga Aquatic Centre. Swimming is the only sport that could save your child's life. Drowning is still one of the most common causes of accidental death in children, so being able to swim is an essential lifesaving skill. Swimming is also a lot of fun and provides loads of benefits which, once learnt, is rarely forgotten. Swimming is part of the Physical Education program and it is an expectation that all children attend and learn important skills that they can transfer into activities at Port Noarlunga when they participate in the aquatic program in Years 5 and 6.

I encourage you to continue supporting your child/ren with reading at home during the week by choosing a passage of approx. 100 – 150 word to read, this could be a book, a newspaper article, a poem, lyrics of a song, a chapter in a book, or a story book. Then, try this schedule using the same text each night:

- Monday – read to your child/ren (Modelling)
- Tuesday – read and ask your child to read after you (Echo reading)
- Wednesday – read together (Choral reading)
- Thursday – ask your child/ren to read on their own
- Friday – ask your child/ren to read again with expression

Have some fun with this and watch your child grow in confidence as they read throughout the week.

Palmy Award T13

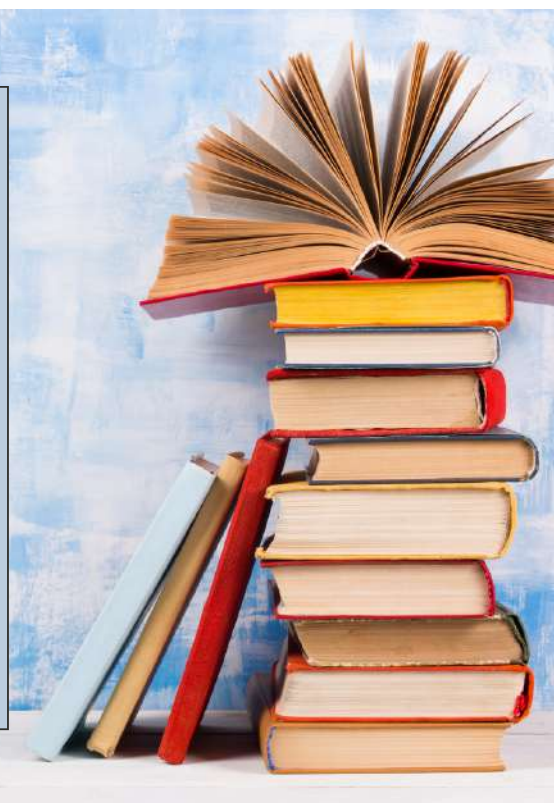
