From the Principal

Dear Parents/Carers,

At the end of last term our Reception to Year 6 students completed the National Bully Survey and this year our Year 2 to Year 6 students also completed the Cyber Bully Survey. These surveys provide us with valuable information about student wellbeing and use of electronic devices. The results from the survey this year has provided us with the following information:-

R-Y3	Y4-Y6	Student responses				
14%	55%	Have mobile phones				
65%	48%	Play on devices 7 days or more				
64%	72%	Play games online				
70%	77%	Are allowed to play their devices in their bedrooms				
87%	86%	Have been bullied online				
41%	89%	Of online bullying has occurred at home				
64%	41%	Feel that they need to learn more about how to protect themselves from cyber bullying				
40%	30%	Feel that their parents need to learn more about how to protect them online				

27% of both R-3 and Yr 4-6 students reported that they play online games when their parents think they are asleep. This is concerning when our students, your children, are reporting that over 80% of online bullying is occurring at home, and only 13% of these students knew the people that were cyber bullying them. Fortunately, a third of these students told their parents that this was occurring or blocked the bully.

Please help us protect our students from online cyber bullying by always supervising them whilst online, ensure that they keep devices out of their bedrooms and do not provide any personal information about themselves to people online. Encourage your child to block and report all incidents of cyber bullying.
