From the Principal

Dear Parents/Carers,

I know a few of our staff and parents took the opportunity to join the online "It takes a village - SafetyNet" program. I personally found this a time to consolidate and reflect on the importance of keeping our children/students safe at home, at school in our community and online.

This SafetyNet program explained what cyberbullying is, what it is not, how to recognise it, information about online activities, dangers, respectful behaviour, gaming and age restrictions in Australia, digital footprint, privacy and where to go for help.

It takes a village - SafetyNet for parents/carers explained bullying, statistics, current online/social media trends and dangers, account management, privacy, and reporting. 'It takes a village - SafetyNet program provided information of how parents/carers can help reduce online risk and harm and where to go for help.

The recommendations from SafetyNet were:-

- Supervise children when using devices
- Keep devices out of bedrooms
- Communicate clear boundaries with children about internet and computer usage in the home
- Stop using devices 1 hour before going to bed
- Access parental control apps on devices
- Ensure children are using age-appropriate apps and platforms
- Access online security settings

I have been privileged to have met many parents/carers of children looking at a school to enrol their preschool age children and we are in the final stages of finalising numbers for our new Receptions starting in 2024, either at the start of the year or mid-year. A parent meeting for the parents of children starting at the beginning of 2024 will be held soon and transition for these children will start early term

Bare Food Award T5






