

From the Principal

Dear Parents/Carers,

Our Pupil Free Day on Tuesday focused on reading, writing and our school improvement plan. Teachers and SSO's focused on continuing their learning about reading instruction groups. Reading instruction groups occur in all classes four times a week and involve two SSO's working in each class with the classroom teacher listening to students read together in a group. R-2 students and students struggling with their reading read decodable readers, while Yr 3-6 competent readers read books selected by their teacher according to their reading level.

During these sessions all students, irrespective of their reading ability, read together chorally while tracking each word being read with their finger. All students read out loud in unison to practise their fluency. Being able to read fluently is an important skill as it supports reading with expression and assists students to develop their confidence. Our goal for these sessions is to improve all students reading accuracy and comprehension.

Teachers also spent time collaborating and sharing information about reading fluency lessons in their classrooms. Thiele Primary School staff have a commitment from all classes to participate in reading fluency lessons each day. These lessons involve teachers teaching explicit lessons modelling fluent reading, developing vocabulary and comprehension as students build their knowledge and understanding of the reading passage throughout the week. By reading the passage several times throughout the week students' confidence in their reading increases and a deeper understanding of the reading content is achieved. The goal of these lessons is to increase students' reading rate and comprehension.

At home you can support your child by reading with them. Have your child follow the words by pointing to them as you read aloud together. Choose a piece of writing that interests your child, it could be a book they have chosen from the library, or brought home form their classroom, a passage of information about a topic they are interested in or to do with an area of study they are learning about at school. Discuss what they think the story will be about, who are the characters, where it is set, choose some words to ensure they know their meaning, then read together as your child tracks the words with you. Repeat this process using the same passage several times during the week and watch your child's confidence and fluency improve. If you would like to discuss this in more detail, contact your child's classroom teacher, Lisa, Aaron or myself

Although teacher interviews are optional this term, if you would like to meet with your child's classroom or specialist teacher to discuss their progress please book a time by contacting your child's teacher or Renata at the Front Office.



### YELP - YOUTH ENVIRONMENT LEADERS PROGRAM

On Wednesday the YELP students attended the second YELP forum at Craigburn Primary School along with students from Nativity, Craigburn, Happy Valley and Coromandel Valley Primary Schools. The activities we participated in were:- soil testing, bird watching, clay moulding, planning our final presentation and we had a tour of the Craigburn Primary School

We learnt that our soil was alkaline in the #2, #4, #5 garden beds as well as our new project area near the Spence building. The area near the COLA was sandy and tested to be acidic. This meant that the garden beds require compost and our new project area is ready to plant and the soil in the garden area at the end of the COLA is suitable for natives.

We also learnt about wicker beds, which are self-watering garden beds, and that birds are attracted to different habitats. These habitats need to have different levels of plants as birds need a canopy which is high, and bushes that provide areas for them to hide at a middle height as well as down low. These areas provide shelter, food and protection for the birds. We saw magpies, rainbow lorikeets, cockatoo, kookaburra, noisy minor, galah, rosella and wrens. We have noticed when we have worked with Simon and in the garden with Roslyn that we have these birds within our school environment too.





Connect, Coach and Take Charge is run by clinical psychologists who have worked with "big feelings kids" for many years. This course will help YOU:

- Learn why some children find it hard to act in calm and co-operative ways
- Know to reconnect and feel more positive about children with big feelings
- Coach your child to learn and practice the skills of feeling calm and solving problems
- Use kind "take charge skills" with children who find it tough to follow instructions
- Be kind and compassionate to yourself as a caregiver of a child with big feelings
- Connect with other parents/caregivers who understand the challenges of taking care of big feelings kids

Our research shows that parents who attend this group report significant changes in parenting behaviours and also that their children show a significant decrease in mental health. 95% of parents/caregivers rate the group as helpful (85% say "very helpful).
