From the Principal

#### Dear Parents/Carers,

Reading and writing are the foundation of all learning. At Thiele Primary School we are proud to say that all of our Year 1 – Year 6 classes have achieved effect sizes greater than 0.4 in their Brightpath narrative writing pre and post test scores. John Hattie's research tells us that 0.4 is the average effect size that represents a year's growth of learning. Teachers have completed their second round of progress monitoring in the area of reading which has also shown growth in individual students learning this term. We are excited with the positive results we are seeing, which is a direct reflection of the reading instruction groups and reading fluency lessons being taught in all classrooms every day.

Making sure that your child/ren read every day is important. Read with them, to them or listen to them read. There are many books available for your child/ren to access from our classrooms or from our library. Did you know that the current collection of catalogued books in the Campus Library is over 14,000 with 2,000 of these borrowed out at any one time. This means that there are approximately 12,000 books available for you and your child/ren when they visit the library.

Next term we are seeing some staff changes as Amanda Allen and Amy Fantus, who would have taught many of our current students over the past years, will be leaving us. Amanda has been successful in gaining a Deputy Principal position and Amy is expecting her first child in December. We wish both Amanda and Amy all the very best and they will both be missed.

Simon Reeves and Emma Dorman will be teaching in T1. Simon will teach T1 students on Monday's and continue teaching JP Science on Wednesday's and Thursday's. Emma will teach T1 students on Tuesday – Friday for the rest of the week. Tracey Collins and Sasha Williams will be teaching in T5. Tracey will teach on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday and Sasha will teach on Thursday and Friday.

The parents/carers of students starting Reception in 2024 will attend a parent meeting on Friday morning. Our new Reception students will start their transition visits on either Tuesday November 7th or Thursday November 9th. We look forward to meeting our new families. Connect, Coach and Take Charge is run by clinical psychologists who have worked with "big

- feelings kids" for many years. This course will help YOU:
- Learn why some children find it hard to act in calm and co-operative ways
- Know to reconnect and feel more positive about children with big feelings
- Coach your child to learn and practice the skills of feeling calm and solving problems
- Use kind "take charge skills" with children who find it tough to follow instructions
- Be kind and compassionate to yourself as a caregiver of a child with big feelings
- Connect with other parents/caregivers who understand the challenges of taking care of big feelings kids

Our research shows that parents who attend this group report significant changes in parenting behaviours and also that their children show a significant decrease in mental health. 95% of parents/caregivers rate the group as helpful (85% say "very helpful).
