Dear Parents/Carers,

This week we have returned after the holidays to welcome Tracey Collins and Sasha Williams who are teaching our Reception students in T5 while Amanda Allen starts her role as Deputy Principal at another site, and Emma Dorman and Simon Reeves who are teaching our Year 1/2 students in T1 while Amy Fantus starts her maternity leave.

All staff have returned to school and have participated in our External School Review on Tuesday and Wednesday this week. The External School Review involves a Review Officer and Review Principal coming into our school to observe classroom teachers teaching, students learning, talk to leadership, teachers, students, SSO's and parents. I would like to especially thank the parents who took the time to be involved in this process as well as our amazing teachers, students and SSO's. It was wonderful hearing that the students who had participated in the group discussions were the best that these reviewers had ever spoken to. We will receive formal feedback about our progress since our last External Review in 2019 and our next steps soon.

As well as the opportunity to speak to staff, students and parents the Review Officer and Principal participated in a tour of our school and observed students participating in Spelling Mastery, Reading Instruction Groups, Reading Fluency, InitiaLit, intervention lessons and other lessons occurring at other times when they conducted walkthroughs.

Our new Reception students will start their transition visits on either Tuesday's or Thursday's from 9am to 10am for three weeks starting on November 7th and 9th respectfully, and then attend again on Tuesday November 28th where all students attend school from 9am to 11:30am. We look forward to meeting our new families. 2024 Materials and Services Charges

Dear Parent/Caregiver,

We continue to require your support with regard to our annual materials and services (M&S) charges often referred to as 'school fees'. In consultation with our Governing Council, the aim is always to provide the highest quality learning environment and resources for our students, while managing the financial burden on families.

Our Governing Council are proposing that our materials and services charge in 2024 remain at \$330.00. the same as 2023. This will allow us to maintain and further develop our learning programs without additional pressure on families. An itemised breakdown of this proposed materials and services charge is attached.

In 2024, we will be continuing to support a comprehensive digital strategy for our school. This will include the final implementation of the ICT Uplift that has begun in 2023, providing students and staff with access to modern learning technologies and digital resources. We will work closely with our Governing Council and communicate with all families as we continue this improvement process, to ensure any major decisions impacting future materials and services charges and/or costs to parents/caregivers are sustainable and well-considered.

The Materials and Services Charges for 2024 will be discussed at the Governing Council meeting to be held 31st October at 7.00pm in the Thiele PS staffroom. All members of the school community are welcome to attend this meeting to join in the discussion. An online voting process will be sent to parents to approve the amount as a 'legally recoverable' amount following the meeting. In lieu of attendance at the meeting, parents/caregivers may also express their views in writing to the Chairperson of the Governing Council Jackie Williams (dl. 1664.govcouncil@schools.sa.edu.au).



Connect, Coach and Take Charge is run by clinical psychologists who have worked with "big

- feelings kids" for many years. This course will help YOU:
- Learn why some children find it hard to act in calm and co-operative ways
- Know to reconnect and feel more positive about children with big feelings
- Coach your child to learn and practice the skills of feeling calm and solving problems
- Use kind "take charge skills" with children who find it tough to follow instructions
- Be kind and compassionate to yourself as a caregiver of a child with big feelings
- Connect with other parents/caregivers who understand the challenges of taking care of big feelings kids

Our research shows that parents who attend this group report significant changes in parenting behaviours and also that their children show a significant decrease in mental health. 95% of parents/caregivers rate the group as helpful (85% say "very helpful).
