Dear Parents/Carers,

We hope that you had an enjoyable holiday break and were able to spend quality time with your families. On Monday, at our Pupil Free Day, staff spent time analyzing student reading data to identify groups of students for our Reading Instruction Groups this term. Reading Instruction Groups occur every day for 15 minutes. Students are placed into 3 groups and provided with a book to read at their reading instruction level. SSO's and teachers read with the students and discuss vocabulary, tricky words and comprehension questions to support student understanding of the book. We have been delighted with the reading improvement we are seeing in all of our students due to this process and the reading fluency lessons each day.

The students were tested at the end of last term and placed into new groups to work on their Spelling Mastery lessons, which start at 8:55am each morning. Again, we have been delighted with the improvement in all students due to their engagement in this program. A friendly reminder to please ensure your children arrive to school on time to allow for maximum engagement with Spelling Mastery.

During the holidays we had a group of community gardeners, including 5 children and their parents, at the school community garden. A lot of work was achieved including some planting by the happy little gardeners. The nets over the fruit trees have started to be removed, so that we can prune the trees. If anyone has any contacts of someone who can come in and assist us in pruning our fruit trees we would appreciate their support.

Next week our YELP, Youth Environment Leaders, will be travelling to Glenthorne National Park to participate in their first forum. The students are looking forward to having some time to plan their project for the year.

If you have any spare time during the day to volunteer some time we are continuing to seek volunteers to assist in the canteen any morning Monday to Friday and in the Play Café on Friday mornings.

Autism Inclusion Update

Hi families, and welcome to Term 2!

Last term I attended a 2-day Positive Partnerships workshop where the focus was how we can best support autistic students in our school.

First of all, I learnt that when referring to students with autism, it's best to ask the child or family how they wish to identify/what they wish to be called (this is of course if the students' diagnosis is common knowledge). Although we were taught the term "student with autism" was acceptable, some autistic people have reported that they don't like this because they feel the autism is separated from their identity. Referring to a child as "autistic" is quite popular but again, it's best to ask. I learnt that we no longer say "non-verbal" and that we are encouraged to say "non-speaking". If you haven't learnt about the "Sunflower Program" it may pay to look into it. If someone is wearing a sunflower lanyard, broach, wristband etc, it may mean they are living with a hidden disability, such as autism. The program creates awareness and inclusivity and I'd like to work towards Thiele being a sunflower supporter. You can google the program to purchase lanyards etc and to find out more.

Please know I am here if you need any support or resources, as there were a few other excellent programs and educational websites I discovered too.

I would also like to remind everyone that each Wednesday at lunchtime my classroom is open to all students that may like to hang out in a calm environment. Accessing technology and quiet games during this time is now ok too, or if you have a child that benefits from "information dumping", they are welcome to come along and chat my ear off **e**.
